

When we all last met in April at our section conclave in Mississippi, one of the promises that I gave when I was on that stage was to improve overall section communications and our branding/presentation. Something that I had started to notice more that other Sections or other Lodges around the area were starting to do was that they were starting to create a social media presence. Seeing some of those posts, I wanted to do the same thing for our section and have more weekly posts rather than a long span of time where we would be dormant, which gives off an impression that we aren't active and don't do anything. So, knowing that, improving our social media insights and quality was something that I proposed at our Section Annual Planning meeting with Tyler and Johnny. Overall, according to Meta Business insights, we have seen close to a 150% growth in our Facebook "reach", which is the total number of people who see our content, and a 75% growth in our Instagram reach. I'm happy to see that he has made such a large growth in that statistic, mainly because it shows that people from outside of our Section and Scouting are seeing what we are doing.

What I plan to do and keep doing is obviously still to improve those statistics. We have a good start on that, but I want to start incorporating more Lodge-level action, like Fall Fellowships/Pow Wows, Ordeal Weekends, and any events that occur on the lodge level. Secondly, as the Scout year begins, I want to eventually start doing a monthly Lodge Chief/Vice Chief call to keep our lodges informed on what to expect from conclave as we get closer to that event, as well as any future Section Events/information gets processed. Talking to our Chief and Vice-Chief, we all agree that Section-To-Lodge communication has vastly improved. Communication has never been better than before, but we are always still looking to improve. As an incentive and to increase Lodge Engagement, I will be looking to continue Arrowman of the Month, a monthly nomination post will be sent out to Lodge Chiefs starting in September and will continue through April. AOM's will be featured on our social media and will also receive a plaque at Conclave. We have our final NLS coming up in November, I highly encourage you all to sign up. Slots fill up fast, Atlanta typically sells out, and the nearest NLS in our area won't be until 2025.

For our spring fellowship, we went whitewater rafting and had a fun time trying not to injure ourselves. Cowikee lodge is looking forward to our fall ordeal and excited to welcome the next generation of arrow-men.

Section Service Fund

Excerpt from E4 Service Grant Application:

E4 Service Grant Guidelines

The E4 Service Grant was established to provide financial assistance to lodges to make specific council camp improvements. One grant will be given out on an annual basis based upon the availability of funds. Lodges wishing to receive the grant must fill out an application. Once applications are received by the Section, a pre-selected group of Arrowman from outside of E4 will select a lodge to receive the grant based upon a standard set of guidelines set forth by the COC.

The grant will consist of \$2,000.00 presented by E4 to a selected lodge. The Section will announce the grant recipient at the awards ceremony on Sunday of Conclave. The funds will be disbursed after the conclave account is settled for that year. The lodge will in turn use the grant money to make a specific council camp improvement (as outlined in their application) that will benefit all users of the camp. Once the project is completed, the lodge should provide a report to the section showing the before and after of the project area.

In the event that funding is available, a second grant of \$1,000.00 may be awarded.

Grant Funding

- 1. The grant will be funded from the proceeds of the annual Patch Auction conducted at Conclave, from the sale of section merchandise, and from any other sources as directed by the COC.
- 2. The COC will hold excess grant funds in reserve to fund any shortfalls in grant revenue for future years.
- 3. In the event that all grant funding has taken place and the account is less than \$2000.00, then the section will use funds from the Grant reserve to fund the shortfall. In the event that the combined funds are less than \$2,000, the COC will award the grant for the amount available.
- 4. If the section fails to raise \$2,000.00 for the grant for two successive years, then the COC may vote to alter the annual amount of the grant to better accommodate the funding capabilities of the section.

Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Lodge must have its Chief and/or Vice Chief present at both the Fall and Spring COC's of the same conclave year.
- 2. Lodges must contribute to the fundraising process. Judgment for the contribution made by the lodge can be regulated by the Section Chief and Adviser.
- 3. Once the Grant is awarded and accepted, the recipient lodge must report back to the Section leadership a summary report of how the funds were used, including photographs. This report is due by the following conclave (12 months).
- 4. Lodges are encouraged to provide matching funds toward the total cost of the project.

Application Process

- 1. Lodges must adhere to the E4 Service Fund guidelines. If needed, due to extenuating circumstances (i.e., hurricanes, etc.), the COC may alter the guidelines for a specific year.
- 2. All applications must be turned in to the Section Chief by the January COC. Any application received after that will not be eligible. If there is no COC meeting in January, the Section Chief will set a due date and notify all COC members of that date.
- 3. Any eligible lodge seeking the grant must complete a current E4 Service Grant Application. The application and guidelines must be reviewed and approved by the COC annually.

Selection Process

- 1. The Section Chief and Adviser will be responsible for appointing the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee will consist of a minimum of five (5) National Committee Members to include at least 2 of the current youth National Officers. No members of E4 will be allowed to serve on this committee.
- 2. Each member of the committee will receive one vote during the selection process. Based on the criteria established within the E4 Service Fund guidelines, the committee will select an application to receive the grant.
- 3. In the event there is a tie among the members of the selection committee, the tie breaker will be decided by the Section Key 3.
- 4. Once the applications have been turned in to the Section Chief, it is the Section Chief's job to disperse the applications to each member of the selection committee.
- 5. The selection committee should only use the Grant Application to make a decision for which lodge should receive the service grant. The section chief will keep the "Biography Page" of the application and send a copy of the "Project Description Page" of the application to the selection committee.
- 6. All Lodge, Camp, and Council-specific information will be removed from the application BEFORE it is sent to the selection committee members.

Selection Criteria

- 1. The selection should be based on the need and total benefits of the project.
- 2. The project should benefit all parties of the camp.
- 3. All decisions must be based on information contained within the Service Fund Application.
- 4. No lodge may receive the grant in two consecutive years, unless no other eligible applications are submitted.
